## 2024 Qualifications

Qualifying participants can receive up to \$2,000 per grower, per year. There is a three-year cap on all practices, per field.

- Low disturbance manure injections or surface applications must be less than 10,000 gallons/ac.
- Grazing may include costs like: fencing, water systems, seed etc., to convert suitable areas to long-term pasture. Receipts must be submitted.
- The equipment conversion stipend helps to update Planting Equipment that successfully lessens soil disturbance; receipts and photos must be submitted.
- Nutrient testing may include: forage, manure, pre-sidedress Nitrate, tissue samples and biomass. Results and receipts must be submitted.

**To receive Incentive Payments of any kind, field maps and a signed contract form must be submitted, acknowledging the payment for implementing soil health practices.**

\*Incentive rates are effective for calendar year and are subject to change\*
